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Executive Summary

The American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) Continuing Education (CE) team is the connection between members, ASHA Approved CE Provider organizations, and licensing and credentialing bodies. ASHA CE facilitates the delivery of the highest quality courses and strives to ensure that members' maintenance of their certification and license(s) is seamless. Conceived in 1979 with 15 ASHA Approved CE Providers, 30 courses, and 450 ASHA CE Registry users, ASHA CE has grown to 530 Providers, 39,000 course offerings, and 123,000 ASHA CE Registry users in 2018.

It has been the practice of ASHA CE to periodically share information on courses, subject codes, and other collected data. This report offers a more comprehensive look at the size and scale of the market for continuing education in audiology and speech-language pathology. The contents, in combination with the data you collect, may be useful in identifying areas of opportunity, needs assessment, and benchmarking.

This *ASHA CE Data Report* provides information on the number of courses registered with ASHA CE, the number of course offerings held, and the number of participant submissions that were eligible to earn ASHA continuing education units (CEUs). Those numbers are examined further through a variety of other data, providing additional detail by subject code, course type, course level, and various relevant demographic information.

The *ASHA CE Data Report* includes information on approximately 530 ASHA CE Providers for the 2018 year and includes data from 2017 and 2016 for comparison purposes.

Key Takeaways

- Course registrations increased by 4% in 2018, with “Individual” course types (i.e. self-study) seeing the largest percentage gain.
- Course offerings increased by 12% in 2018.
- 2018 participant submissions that were eligible to earn ASHA CEUs decreased by 9%. This is possibly due to a number of providers offering free courses in 2017 but fewer doing so in 2018.

ASHA CE strives to support our Providers in these efforts, offering resources, services, and information to facilitate high-quality continuing education.

About the ASHA CE Data Report

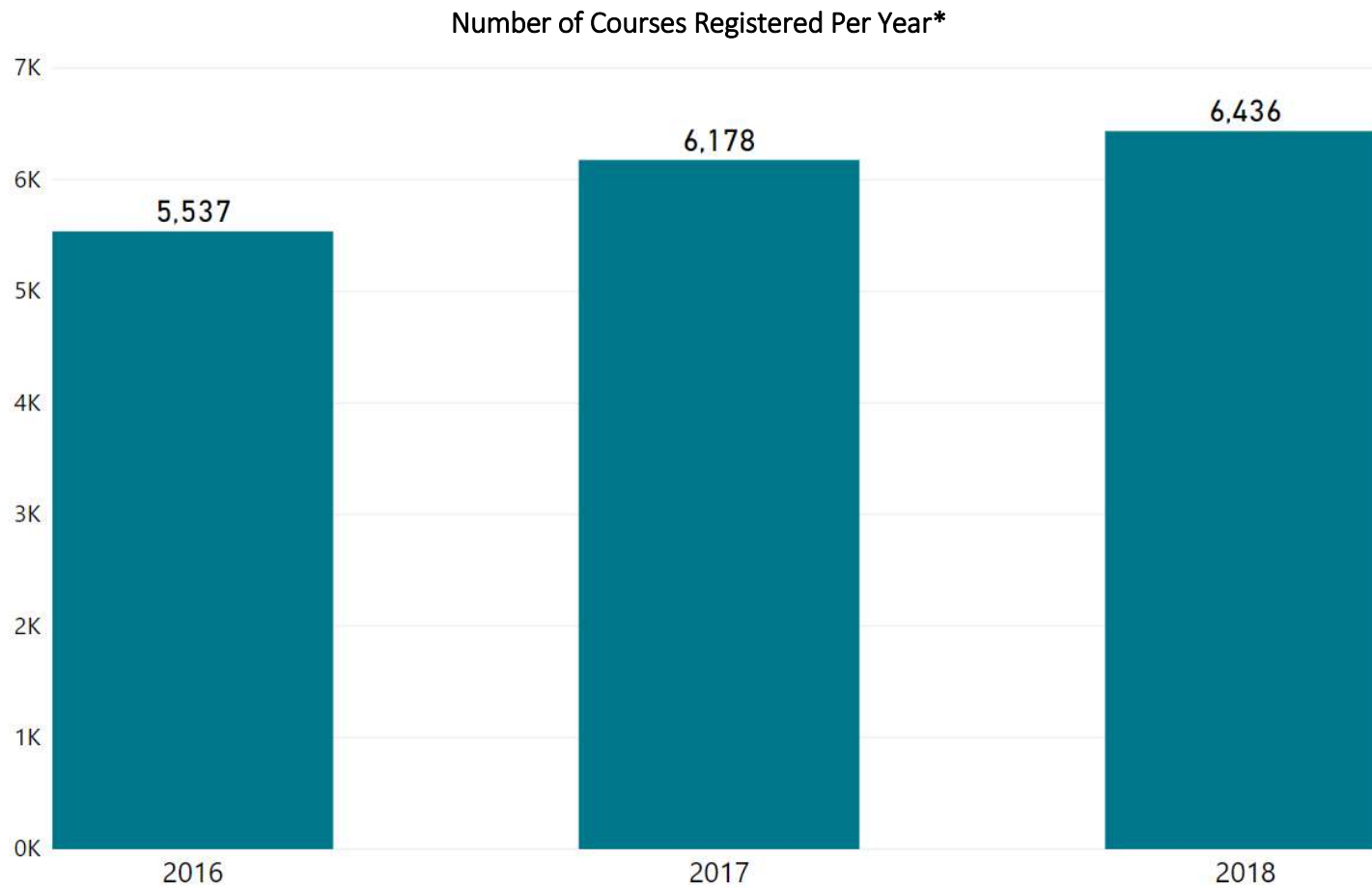
The *ASHA CE Data Report* is from data submitted by approximately 530 ASHA Approved CE Providers. Data are aggregated to protect the security of Provider and participant information. Providers register courses with ASHA throughout the year; they also register each separate offering of that course. When a Provider conducts a course offering, all attendees who would like to earn ASHA CEUs for completing that course offering submit their information through the ASHA CE Provider who registered it. The Provider then sends a complete list of all participants to ASHA for awarding of ASHA CEUs.

This report does not take into consideration if a participant has paid the ASHA CE Registry fee in the year of their participation. All participant counts shown in this report represent every participant submission that ASHA CE received, and that ASHA CE determined eligible for ASHA CEUs, regardless of whether the person was an ASHA CE Registry member.

Any chart that contains multiple colors in this report also contains a legend. In a few cases, colors in the charts may be similar to one another. In those instances, the order of items in the chart follows the order of items in the legend, to make the data more understandable.

Registered Courses

The number of courses registered each year by ASHA CE Approved Providers continues to increase, while the number of Providers remains consistent. 2018 saw a 4.2% increase in courses registered over the previous year.

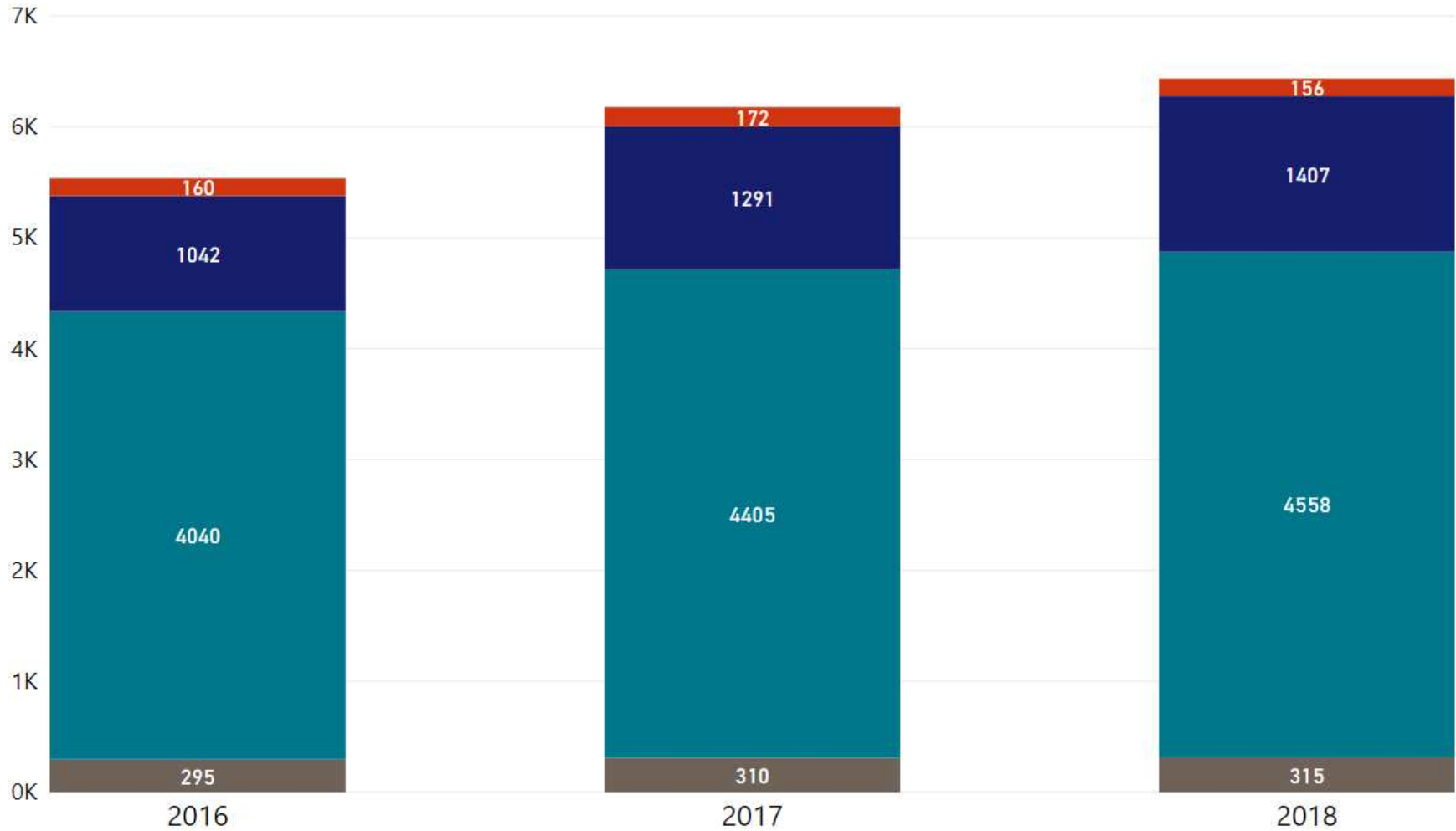

Number of Courses Registered by Course Level

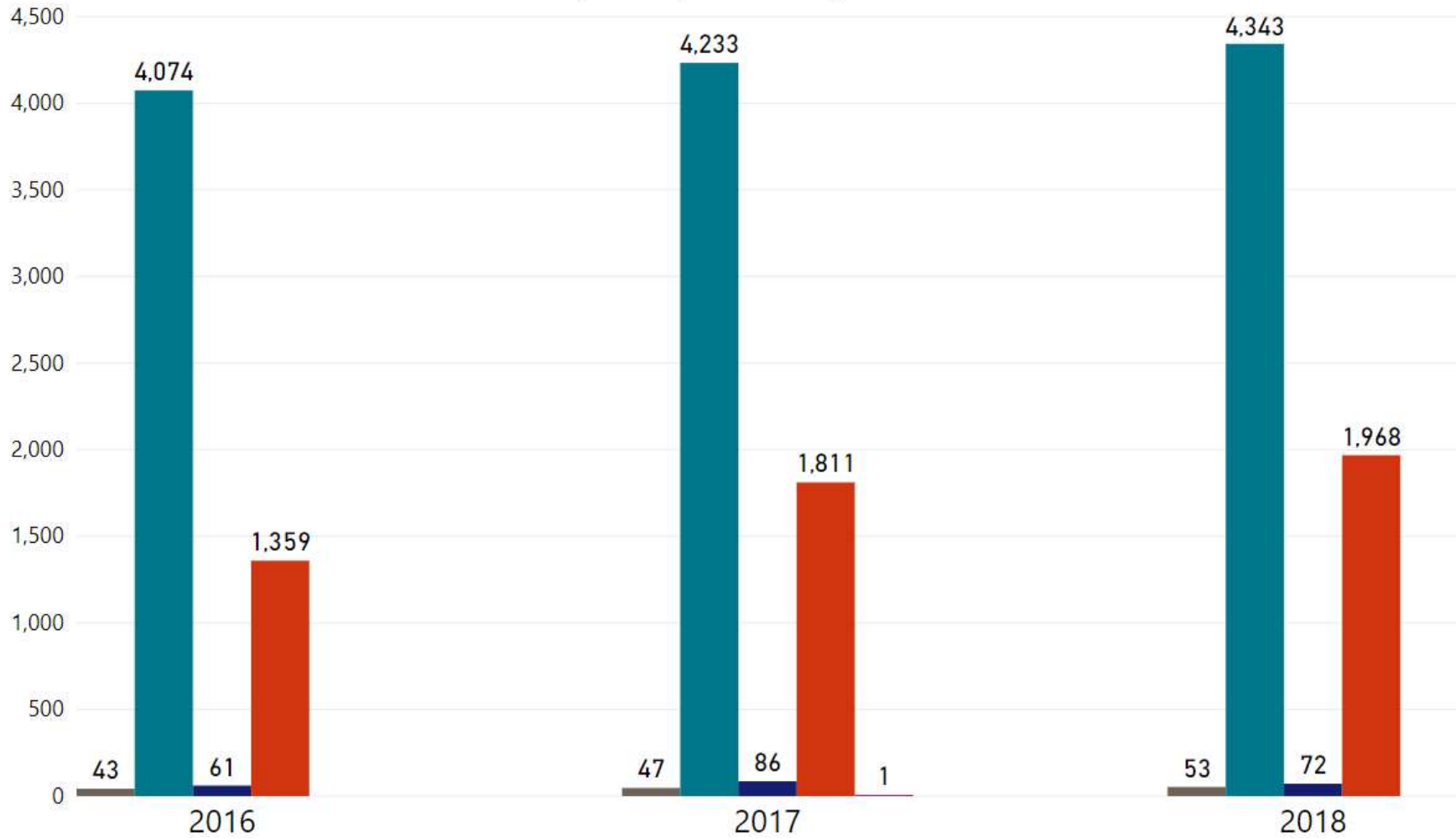

- Intermediate course registrations had the greatest increase in 2018 (+153), while Introductory course registrations saw the greatest percentage increase (+9.0%) in 2018.

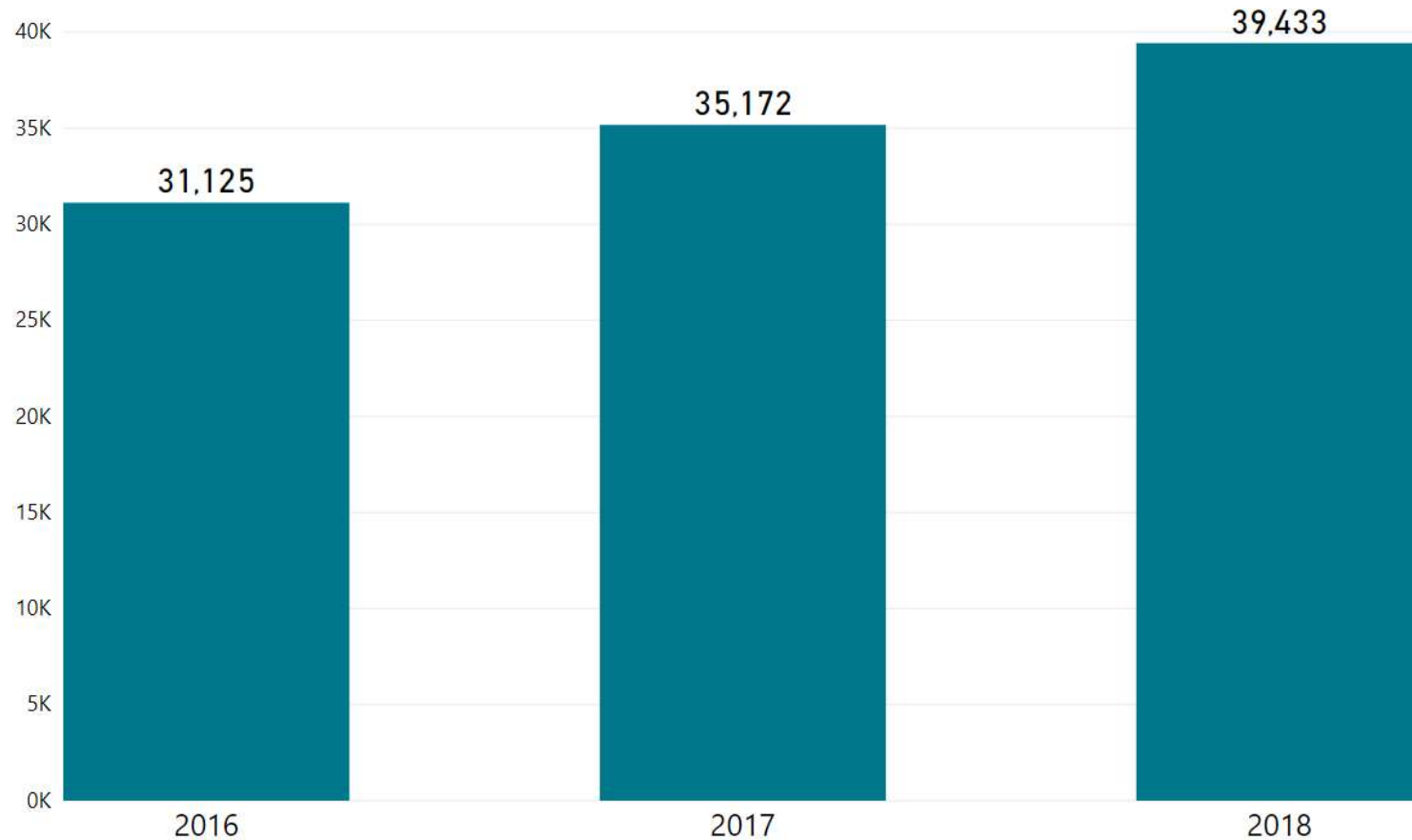

Number of Course Offerings Held Per Year*

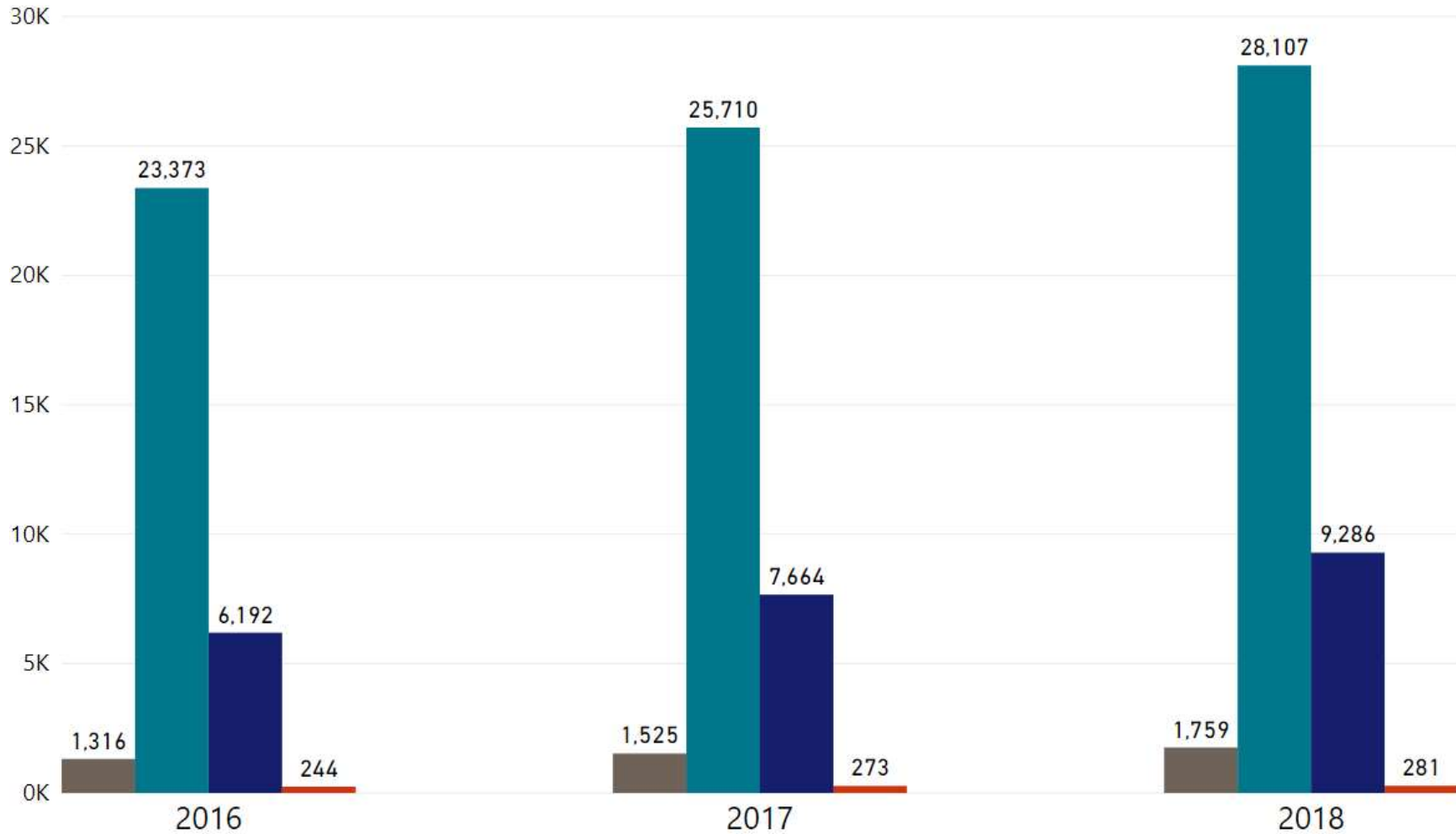

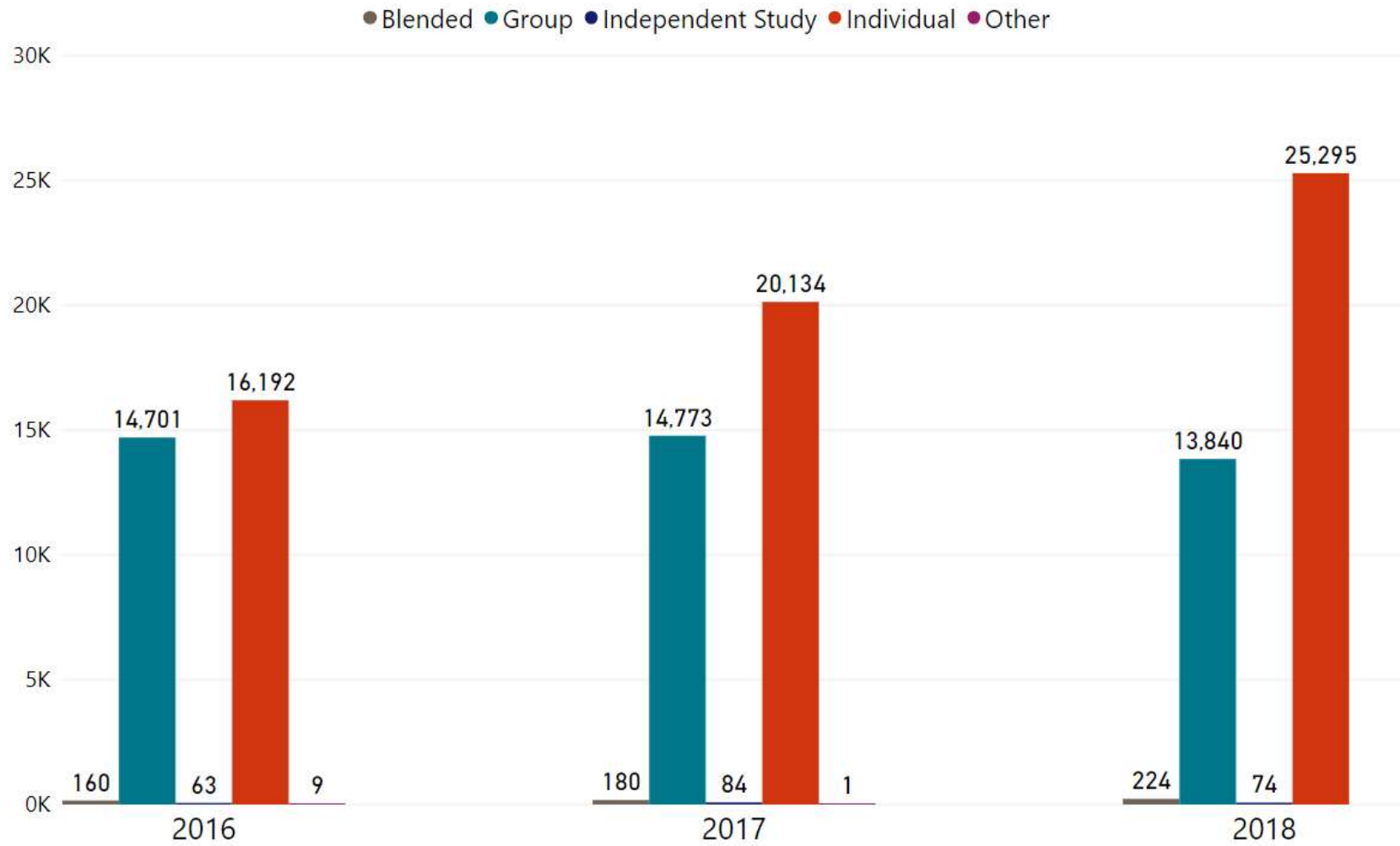
Number of Course Offerings Held by Course Level

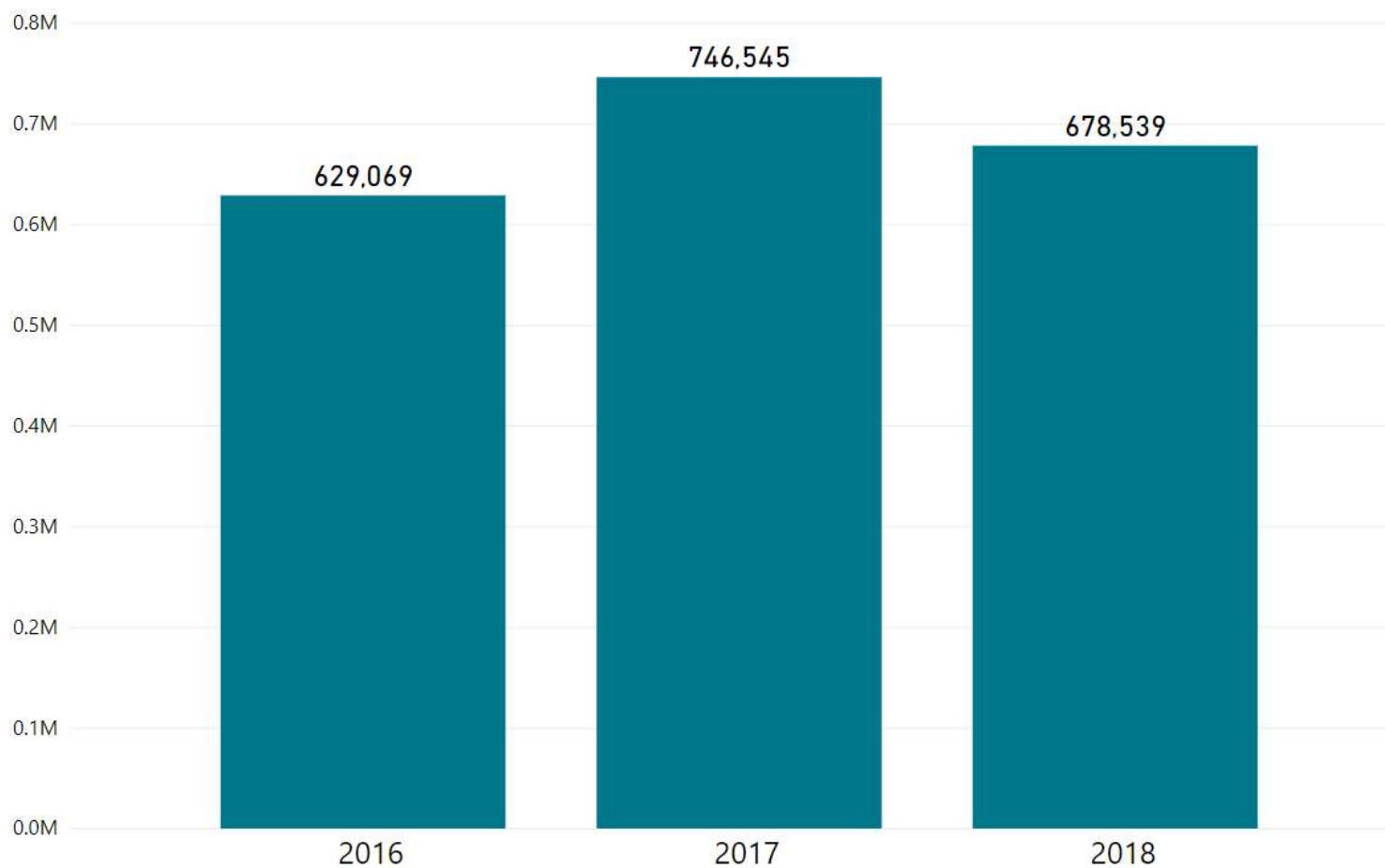

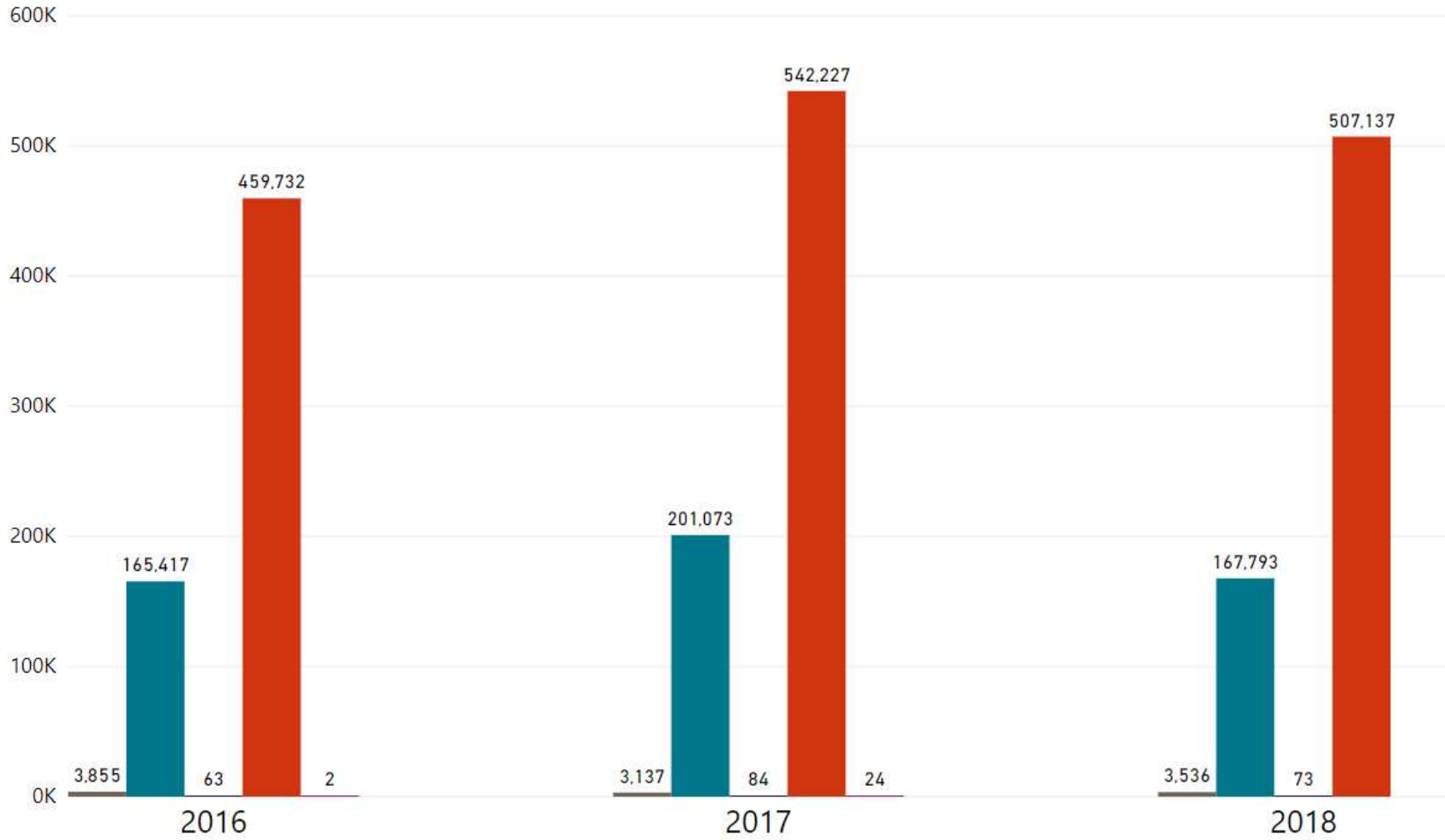
Total Participant Completions by Course Level

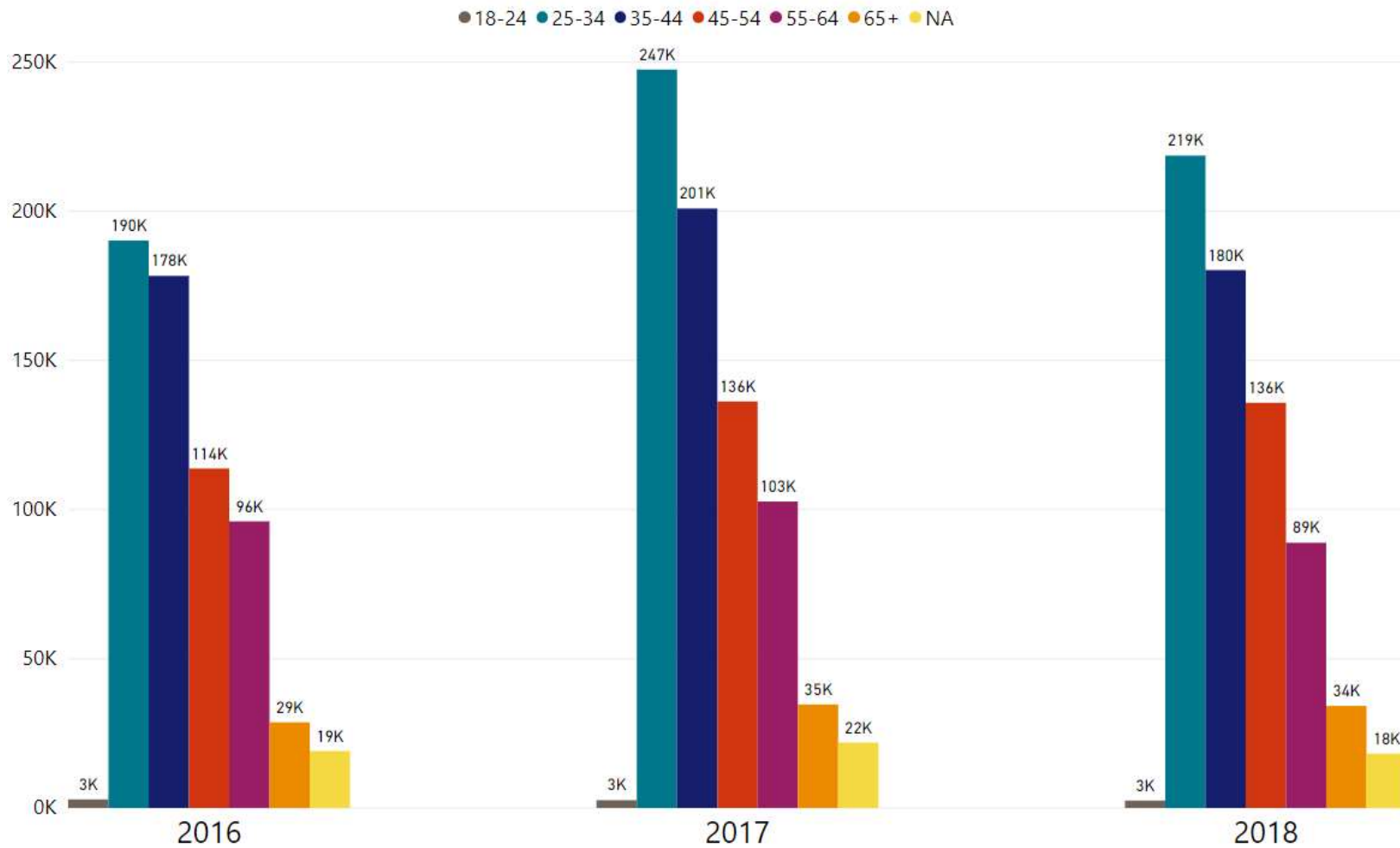

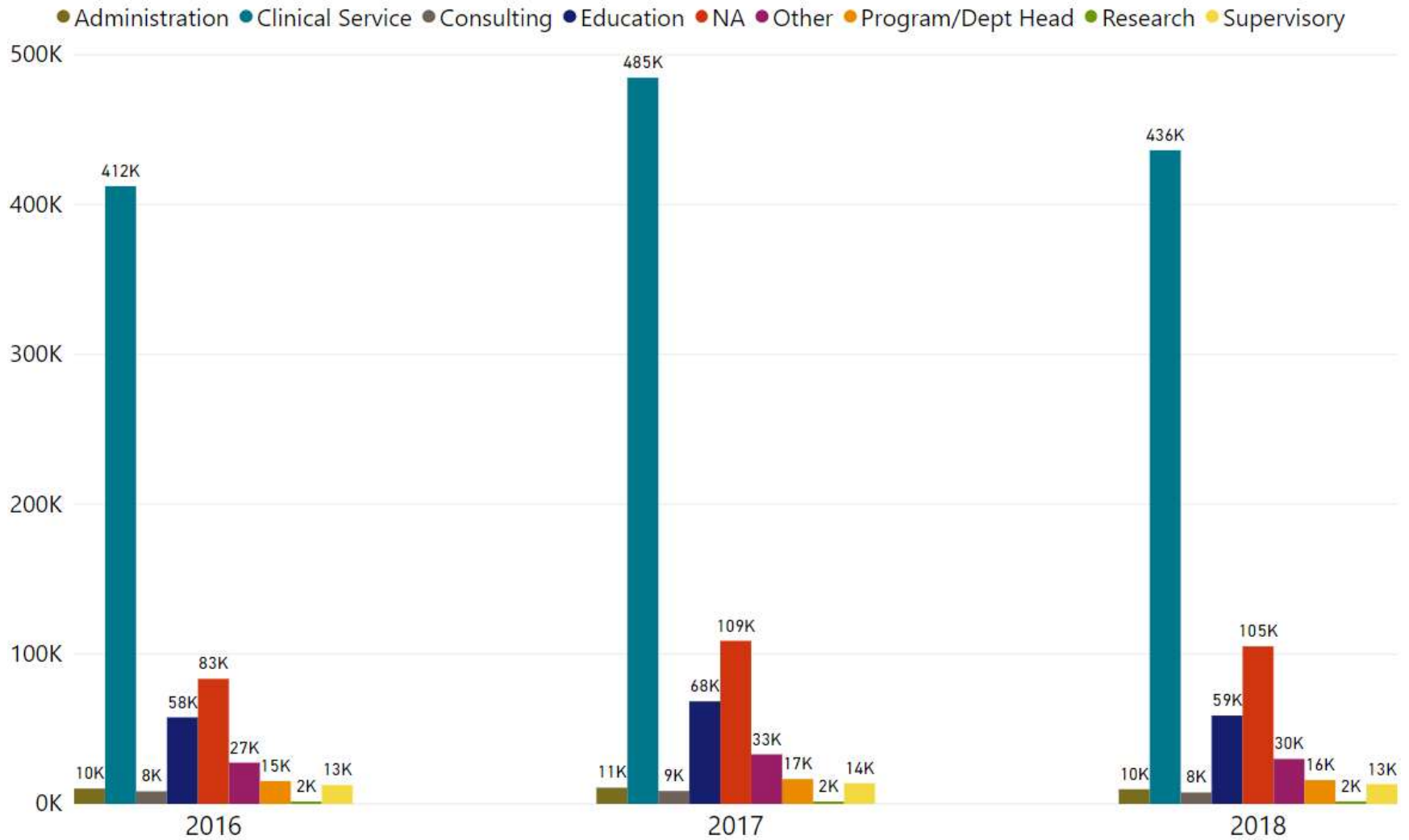

Total Participant Completions by Age of Participant*



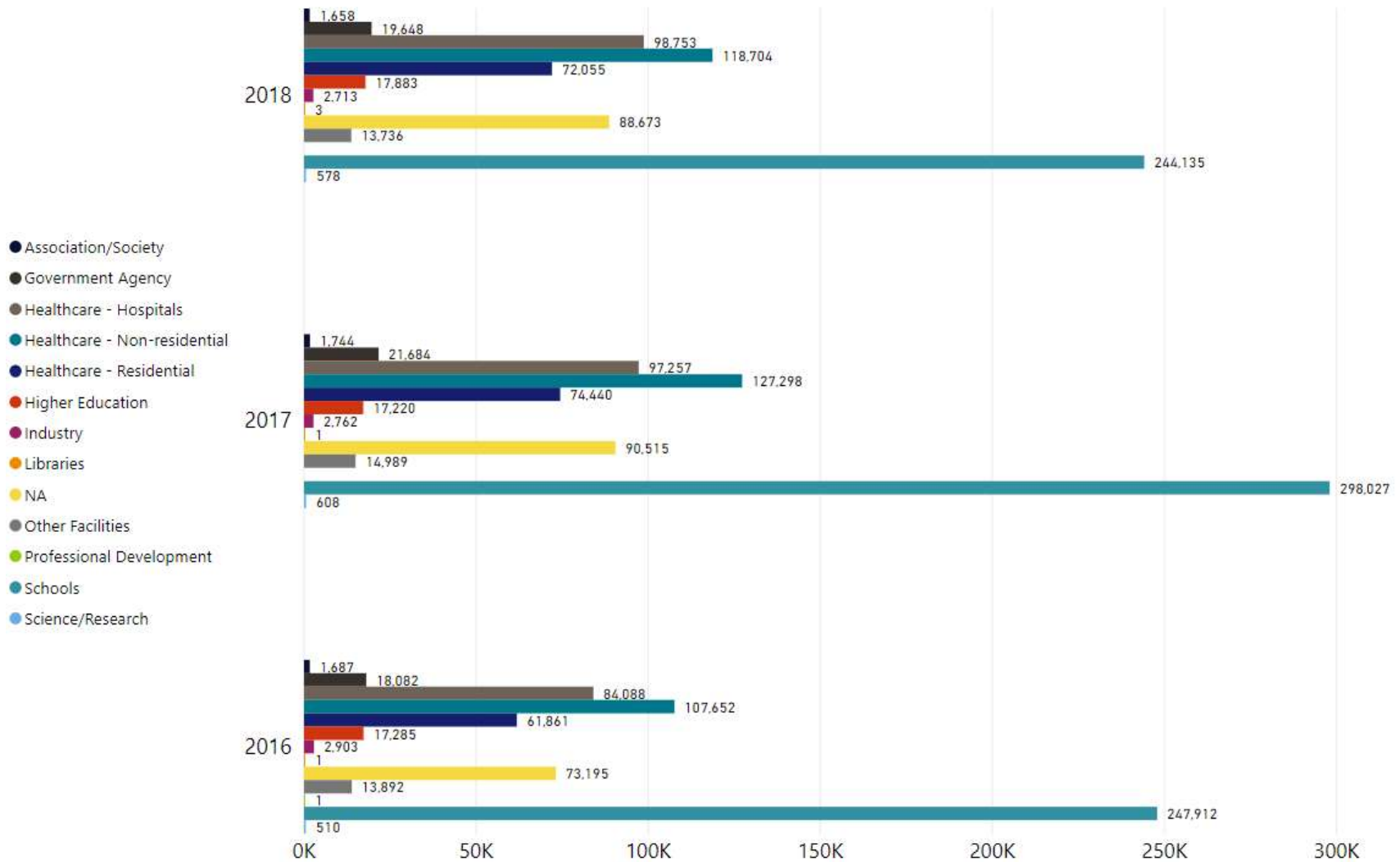

Total Participant Completions by Current Primary Function*



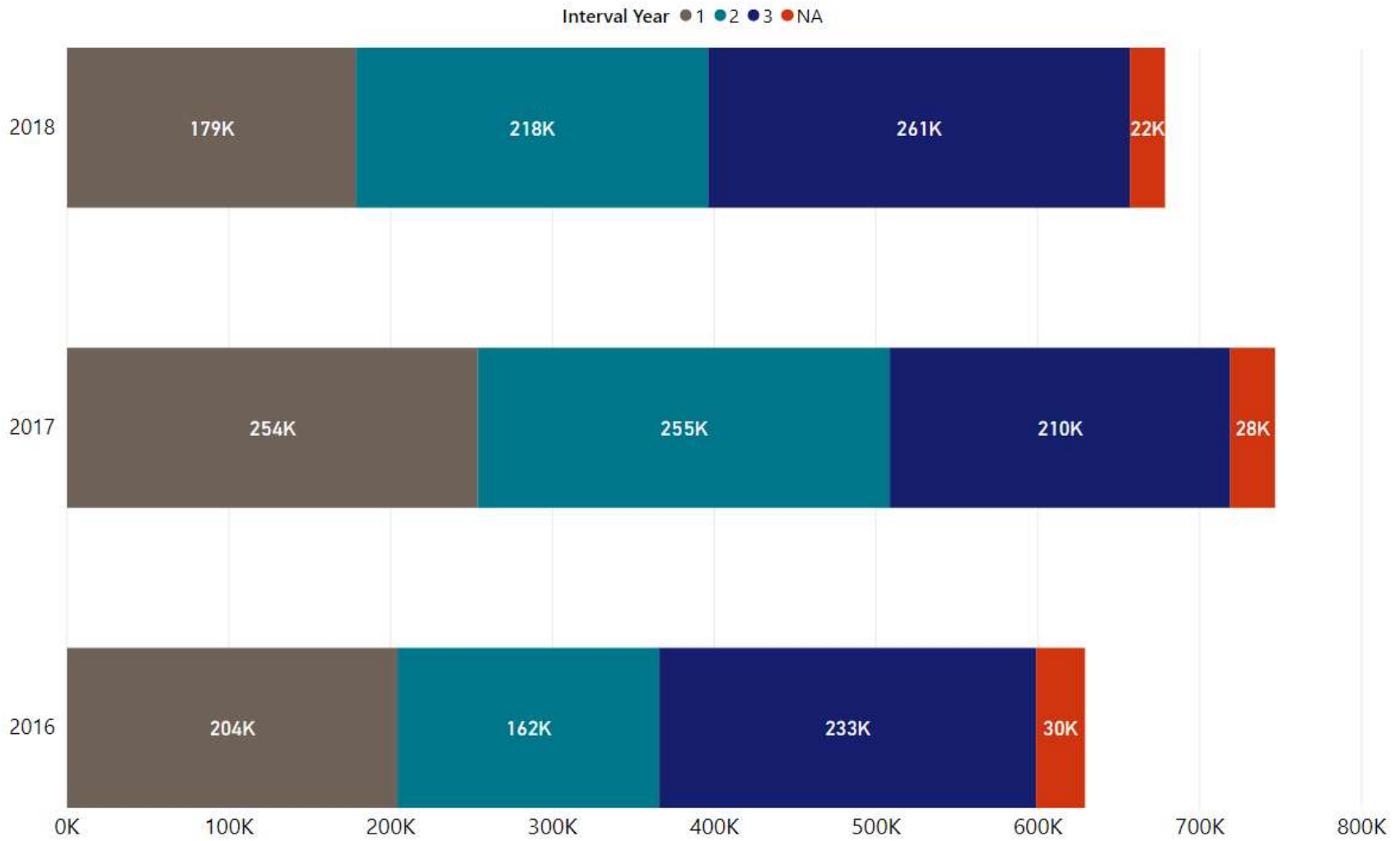

Total Participant Completions by Current Primary Facility*



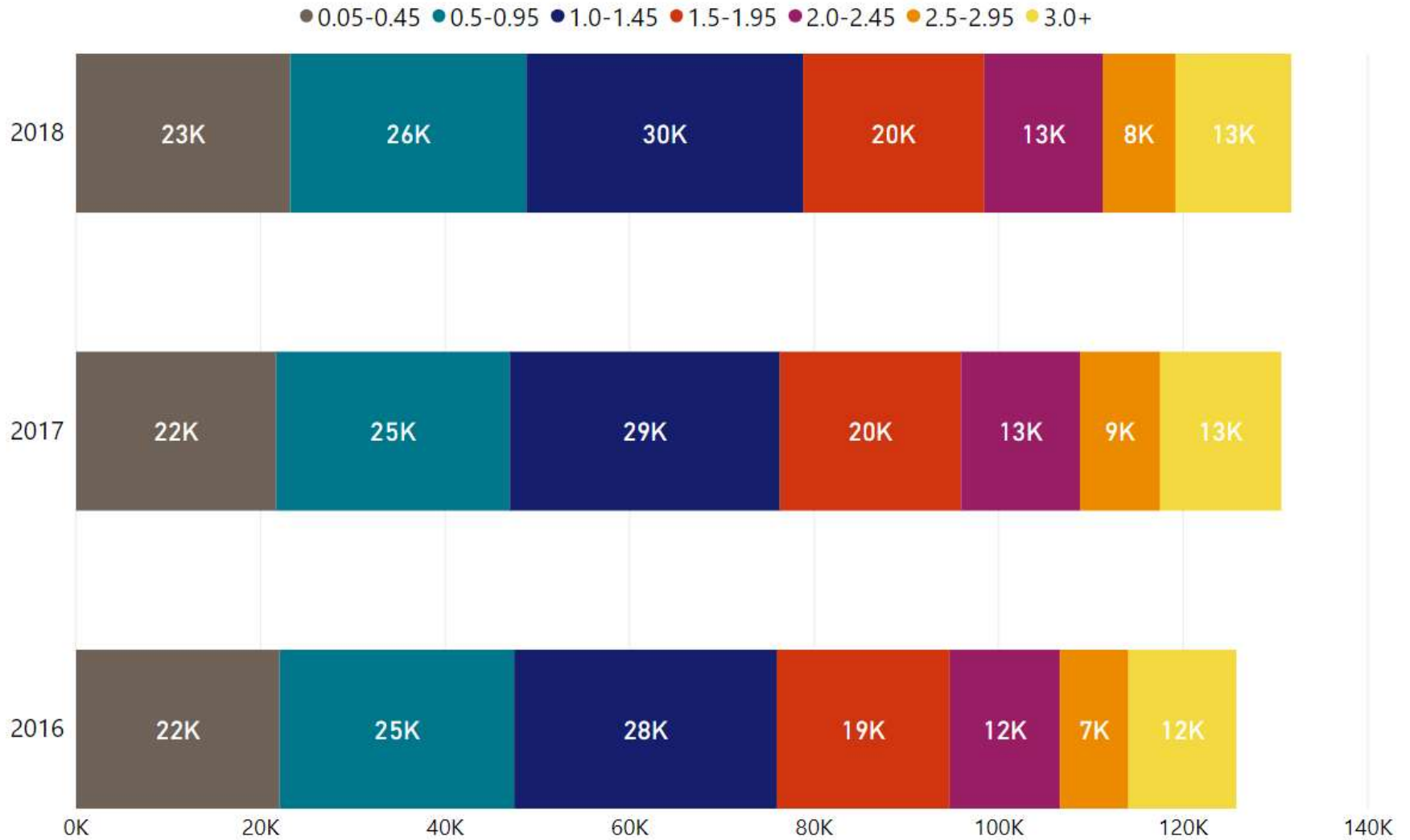
