## RSPs and SISPs ... Defined

#### **Related Service Provider**

As defined in Section 602 of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA, 20 U.S.C. 1401), \*Related Services\* refers to the support services provided by qualified professionals to students with disabilities. These professionals, known as related service providers, are essential members of the Individualized Education Program (IEP) teams and other educational teams. Related services are tailored to help students achieve their specific IEP goals and are not a one-size-fits-all solution. These services must be aligned with the student's IEP goals and clearly specified within the IEP itself.

#### **Specialized Instrumental Support Personnel**

The Every Student Succeeds Act (2015) defines the term specialized instructional support personnel refers to a range of qualified professionals who provide essential services to students. These personnel play a key role in delivering services such as assessment, diagnosis, counseling, education, therapy, and other necessary support (including related services as defined in Section 602 of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. 1401) as part of a comprehensive program to address students' needs.



## RSPs versus SISPs ... who are they?

#### **RSPs**

- Transportation
- Speech-language pathology and audiology
- Physical and occupational therapy
- Counseling services
- School health services
- Social work services
- Assistive technology

#### SISPs\*

- Counselors,
- Social workers,
- Psychologists,
- Nurses,
- Speech Language Pathologists, and
- School librarians

\*Other school-based qualified professional personnel that are involved in providing assessment, diagnosis, counseling, educational, therapeutic, and other necessary services.










# 2022 Union Representation







Active RSPs within their local unions are able to educate others on the roles and responsibilities of RSP's


Active RSPs help bring to light some of the unique needs of our professions
