Amount of Supervision Required	The amount of direct supervision must be commensurate with the student's knowledge, skills and experience; Must not be less than 25% of the student's total contact with each client/patient and Must take place periodically throughout the practicum. Additionally, at least 18 other monitoring activities must occur during the experience. The mentoring SLP will use these observations to assess performance and evaluate progress toward achieving the skills necessary for independent practice.
